VACCINATION UPDATE

If you have been invited down to the vaccination centre at the Harpenden Halls in the last few weeks, it is quite possible that you have seen some familiar Davenport faces. Our nurses Heather, Mary, Helen, Sharon, Rosie and Christina have all been down there at various times as have Drs Thenuwara, Cashyap, Yasotharan, Bagga and Kirsop.

As some of you may be aware Dr Thenuwara has been instrumental in helping get the vaccination centre up and running and is one of 3 Harpenden GPs who has taken on the responsibility of running each clinic along with an operational lead. This means that it might be slightly harder to get an appointment with Dr Thenuwara in the next few weeks while the vaccine centre develops, but we do still have plenty of clinicians back at the Surgery (see overleaf) who are more than capable of dealing with any medical issues you may be having. It will also mean that the days each GP is working at the Surgery will change week on week depending on when they are needed at the centre.

We are doing everything we can to maintain as many of the normal services at the Surgery as well as vaccinating as many people as possible against Covid, but please bear in mind it is not always possible to keep the number or flexibility of appointments that would usually be the case.

We are proud to say we have managed to vaccinate all our eligible patients in all our care homes across Harpenden and shortly we will have made it out to all our vulnerable patients who are unable to get to the Public Halls.

As you may be aware from the news, we are now able to move into priority group 5, having invited everyone from groups 1-4, more than 90% of whom have been vaccinated. We are hugely grateful to all the volunteers, of which there are many, who have made this vaccination programme possible. We really couldn't have done it without you. So a very big thank you to all those involved, including GPs, nurses, volunteers and you the patients.

Many of these roles have been granted to us through the Primary Care Network (PCN) which means we share the services across all three Harpenden Practices. This may mean that they only work a few days here at Davenport House or they may work remotely.

As a training Practice we have a number of registrars joining us and moving on once their training is fulfilled. We currently have with us:

We have two first contact physiotherapists, Lisa Simmonds and Miranda Lyell who will assess any musculoskeletal issues for you. You will not be booked in for a course of treatment with these physiotherapists, they will assess you and refer you to get the treatment you need, the same way a GP would.

Physicians Associates (PAs) are a new role to primary care and we have Dhara Patel and Zoe Tranter working with us. They are currently working alongside and supporting our on the day triage team of the duty Doctor and our Minor illness nurse.
